# History In Bull



Michael Gorman, a historian with the National Park Service and now famous for his association with the movie *Lincoln*, is generally regarded as an expert on Civil War photography. He gave an excellent presentation of Civil War photographs in 3-D at the August meeting of the Goochland Historical Society. Gorman explained to the attendees that an estimated 70 percent of photographs from the Civil War era were made to be shown as stereographic cards, an early form of 3-D. The vintage photographs of Richmond during the War years brought this dynamic portion of history to life.


# It's Time to Renew Your Membership for 2013!






# A Night at the Goochland Library

A standing room only crowd was on hand on September 27th to hear a presentation about Dahlgren's Raid and to hear a reading from the Civil War letters of William Callis Kean. The meeting room at the Goochland Branch of the Pamunkey Regional Library was filled to capacity for the first in a weekend long series of events surrounding the reenactment of Dahlgren's Raid.

Dr. Bruce Venter of America's History gave a wonderful presentation on the Kilpatrick-Dahlgren Raid that took place in 1864. In rapt attention, the audience listened as Dr. Venter, through the use of slides and props, set up the circumstances leading up to the Raid including the aftermath surrounding its eventual failure. His thorough knowledge of the event, along with several amusing anecdotes, educated and entertained all in attendance.

After a question and answer session, Scott Johnson took the floor to read a letter written by William Callis Kean after the Battle of Bull Run in 1861. Johnson eloquently gave voice to a man experiencing the horrors of war and deprivation of spirit that many went through during the American Civil War. Silence reigned as listeners imagined what life would have been like for these boys and young men living through the tragedy of war.

On display were several items including a Civil War rifle, a *carte de visite* of Judson Kilpatrick, and a Harper's Weekly magazine featuring news of the failed Raid and the death of Ulric Dahlgren. John T.B. Mudge, a Hobson descendant, came from New Hampshire for the Raid reenactment. He brought along some of his family items including Annie Jennings Wise Hobson's diary. Mrs. Hobson was living at Eastwood, one of the plantations visited by Dahlgren and his troops in 1864 and wrote in her diary a first hand account of that fateful day.

# Gift ideas from the Museum Shop








### NOTE CARDS FROM THE GOOCHLAND COOKBOOK

Local artisan Eva Childress created illustrations of well known old homes in Goochland County for the Goochland Cookbook. The first edition was published in 1976 to commemorate the American Bi-centennial. Eight of those images have been reprinted in the form of note cards. The history of each house is printed on the back of the card. The houses represented are: Hereford Hill, Tuckahoe Plantation, Joe Brook, and Cleveland, Orapax, Wood Lawn, Belvidere, and Hickory Hill. These eight cards, with envelopes, sell as a package for \$8.

# "British Camp"

1550 Maidens Road Sunday, December 16th, at 3:00 p.m.

"British Camp" is the home of Harriet and Clark Meador. Originally built in Chesterfield County, the house was moved to its present location about 1965. Mrs. Meador will describe the history of her home which during the American Revolution was where British Gen. William Phillips bivouacked with his men. Music and refreshments will be provided. "British Camp" is about two miles east of Goochland Courthouse.

**Directions:** From Route 6 (River Road), turn (north) on Route 634 (Maidens Road). The house is just north of the intersection of Route 6 and Route 634. Signs will be posted. Parking is limited.
